SPEAKER BIOS

James M. Beidler, author of three books, including a new guide to newspapers, *The Family Tree Historical Newspapers Guide*, and two books on German genealogy. Beidler also writes the weekly newspaper column "Roots & Branches."

FILBY AWARD

Each year ProQuest sponsors the Filby Award which honors a librarian with at least five years' experience whose primary focus is genealogy and local history and who is employed in a public, academic, or special library. The award includes a \$1,000 honorarium. The Filby Award is named for the late P. William Filby, former director of the Maryland Historical Society and author of many core genealogical reference tools that genealogists have relied on for decades.
