

Scott Eyman will join us virtually to talk about his new book

Author Scott Eyman will be joined by University of Michigan Professor Matthew Solomon, author of BFI Film Classics: The Gold Rush.

In Charlie Chaplin Vs. America: When Art, Sex and Politics Collided, bestselling Hollywood biographer and film historian Scott Eyman tells the little-known story of Charlie Chaplin's fall from grace. In the aftermath of World War Two, Chaplin was criticized for being politically liberal and internationalist in outlook. He had never become a US citizen, something that would be held against him as xenophobia set in when the postwar Red Scare took hold. As soon as he left the U.S. to promote a new picture, FBI director J. Edgar Hoover (who despised Chaplin's politics) persuaded the State Department to revoke Chaplin's visa, thus preventing him from reentering the country.
